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Summer Term Newsletter No.01

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the first newsletter of the summer term, which is being written from the glorious countryside in the Blackdown Hills as children from years 3 and 4 from both schools have completed their Wildside residential experience this week – and what a week (well, 3 days) it has been.

This was my first trip to Wildside on residential, having previously attended upper key stage 2 residentials, and I have been *blown away* by the care, commitment and dedication from Richard and the team here. Everything they do is for the benefit of the children and creates a magical experience, which I have been sorely impressed with. We have a few transport niggles to iron out for the year after next, but we will definitely be coming back. I would also like to thank Mrs. Verrall, Mrs. Howard and Mrs. Gardener for attending the trip with me; these residential experiences would not be possible without staff who are willing to go well over-and-above for the enrichment of our children's experiences and the care and support they have shown towards our children has been first class – a true embodiment of *in loco parentis*.

Unfortunately, I can't dedicate the entire newsletter to the fantastic residential experience we have just had, but there have been two updates sent to parents of children who attended. If you would like to know more about what has gone on here at Wildside, either speak to a parent of a year 3 or year 4 child to ask for the emails to be forwarded to you, or contact either school office.

It is always so lovely to see children returning to school after a break away looking so smart in their uniform and showing that they are so keen to learn; thank you to you all for helping them with this. Something magical must happen on the journey into school because, from personal experience, reluctance to "go back to school" melts away as soon as children see their friends and teachers.

The first week of term has started at pace, with children beginning new teaching units and children in year two and year six entering "exam season". Parents of year 6 children, please encourage your child to work through the CGP revision books we have provided as these are an excellent source of information and subject content that children may be examined on. If you have any queries about either of the

national examinations which will be taking place next month, please speak to your child's teacher, or contact either school office.

Later this term, year 1 children will take the phonics assessment known as the Phonics Screening Check. This is a test to assess and show how well your child can use and apply the phonics skills that they've learnt up to the end of Year 1. There is a pass mark that has to be obtained for the screen to be passed. Children who do not meet the standard this year, will receive extra support in year 2 and are asked by the government to re-take the test in that year.

Later this term too, for children in year 4, is the upcoming Multiplication Times Tables Check (MTC). The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. Please do encourage your child to use the MTC practice materials on TTRockStars as this will help to prepare them for the assessment itself.

Next week, selected children in years 5 and 6 will be attending the Quad Kids Athletics event at Uffculme school. If your child has received an invitation, please complete the necessary permission forms and return to their school office.

I'm sure you will have noticed this week the new entry systems being installed at both schools. This represents the commitment that we have to ensure that the schools' sites are as robust as they can be from a Safeguarding perspective. This represents a substantial investment from the trust, and is one that we have long wanted, but not been able to afford. There are many other improvements and upgrades to both schools' sites on the horizon, which given the wider, educational environment we find ourselves in with the current levels of government funding, is a testament to the benefit of belonging in a family of trust schools.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to a request from our former Executive Head Deborah Eveleigh. She is undertaking a sponsored walk to raise money for Hospicecare. If you are able, please do consider a donation to support this very worthy cause. In addition, there is a Q&A evening coming up — again, details are in the Community Section should you wish to attend.

I hope you have a lovely weekend with your family, and I look forward to seeing you in school next week.


Introducing Webber's KS2 Summer Term Choir




