CHILDREN'S CORNER

Class 1

Academic

Class One have started learning about non-chronological reports through Talk for Writing. Our text is all about frogs which links well to the children's interests. This week, we released and waved goodbye to 6 baby frogs that we have watched transform from frogspawn, through to tadpoles, froglets and now tiny little frogs. We will write a non-chronological report on Frogs over the next couple of weeks. **Community**

Class one really enjoyed reading to the children in Class 3 on the field this week. This was great for their confidence and helping to instil their love of reading. Thank you to Class 3 for being so **kind** and **patient** with us! We look forward to welcoming parents into our class for shared reading next Thursday for half an hour at 9am.

Character Education

We have been talking about respect and thinking about the Golden rule, 'Treat others like you would like to be treated'. I have been wowed by the level and amount of 'Inspiring Researcher' homework children have completed. I'm worried that I'm not going to have space to display it all! You have all done amazingly. I have been given a PowerPoint, a Lego model, Slates with lines written out, a 3D model and lots of amazing posters - you have all been really creative.

Innovation

Some of our Reception children have been very innovative this week building themselves some play equipment out of loose parts. They built both a slide and seesaw, and had a lot of fun playing on them!

<u>Year 2</u>

Academic

We have all returned to school refreshed, motivated and eager to learn this week as we begin the last part of our journey as Year 2s. Children have written some excellent reflective pieces about how they feel when they are 'wild'; influenced by our class text, 'Where the Wild Things Are'. Everyone interpreted this in different ways, and it was fantastic to see the children's creativity and personalities shine through in their writing.

Community

The highlight of our week was when we were given the opportunity to read to our friends in KS2. We relished the opportunity we had to share our love of reading with each other, and it helped to build on our confidence when reading aloud.

Character Education

In Year 2, we have been focusing on the virtue of respect and exploring the Golden Rule. We have been living this through our own actions and demonstrating respect by making choices based on the principle of treating our friends just as we would wish to be treated by them.

Innovation

Year 2 have dived into their maths learning this week and we have learnt to tell the time. Useful mnemonics, rhymes and songs have helped us to remember which time the minute and hour hand are showing us on the clock face. Please ask your children to teach you their clever tricks for telling the time!

Class 2

Academic

Class 2 have embarked on Time as our focus in maths this term and are practising these skills at every opportunity...please support this at home, as it often proves to be a tricky concept to get to grips with! In English, we are exploring poetry and learning the differences between a variety of poetry styles, identifying the features of riddles, rhymes, and tongue-twisters before planning and writing our own. Once completed, we will be developing our Inspiring Speaker skills by reading them aloud to our classmates. Character Education

With the multiplication check upon us (MTC), our Year 4 children are working hard to polish their skills and are all demonstrating **perseverance** and **determination**. They have been keen to practice in many different ways and have enjoyed the introduction of our burger challenge, using traditional rote-style learning to reinforce our knowledge and recall, as well as accessing TTRockstars and DfE support programs. We wish them luck and are proud of their dedication and commitment to their learning.

Community

We are enjoying sharing the outdoor area now that we can play on the field altogether, and have particularly enjoyed accessing the dressing-up trunk. This has seen the introduction of cross key-stage immersive games and opportunities to express ourselves and entertain one another in a safe and inclusive way.

Innovation

In science, we have started our investigations into electricity and circuits and we are beginning to realise just how reliant we are on our ability to access sources of power.

Class 3

Academic

The children have directed their own learning in maths this week: many children asked to revise how to tell the time (using both analogue and digital clocks) and have been challenging themselves with multi-step time problems. It's been wonderful to see the children so proud of their writing this week. We have travelled back in time and became reporters at the execution of Anne Boleyn. The children have begun to write exceptional reports and have presented their work brilliantly using their chrome books.

Character Education

We have been focusing on the virtue of respect this week. Class 3 have considered what respect looks and sounds like; we were so proud of their comments on inclusion and celebrating diversity. It has been wonderful to see children developing their character by taking part in our Open the Book Collective Worship this week.

Community

Year 6 children enjoyed meeting Vikki Barlett and Jo Hill from Uffculme Secondary School this week. They asked some fantastic questions and are clearly looking forward to their transition day on 27th June. We sent a team of girls' footballers to Uffculme on Tuesday: they came back to school buzzing! They played brilliantly together and really enjoyed the experience. It was also great for Class 3 to hear Class 1 readers on the field this week. This is something that we hope to continue in the glorious weather: it was lovely to see the older children supporting the younger children to read aloud and to just stop, read and enjoy a story together.

Innovation

Our peers in Year 4 will be taking Multiplication Tables Checks soon. Class 3 have been supporting Year 4 by thinking of new and interesting ways of remembering some of the more challenging tables. Please ask your child how they might remember 8 x 8, 6 x 8 or 12 x 7! :)

<u>Acorns</u>

Academic

After a busy end to last term writing our own stories based on Beatrix Potter's The Two Bad Mice, we have started this term looking at another popular book, Where The Wild Things Are. We have had fun being imaginative with our language to describe the characters and the setting. EYFS children have started the term very strongly in maths; the adults have been blown away by their knowledge of doubles and their ability to share equally between groups using a range of resources. Year 1 are working with numbers to 100 and year 2 have shown great perseverance and resilience with time and are mastering both analogue and digital! The children have been very curious about different monarchs we have been learning about. This week, we have looked at Alfred the Great; the children were very excited to hear he took refuge locally to us in Somerset!

Community

Acorns class have started thinking about Sports Day this week, excited to welcome our school family and local community to share in the event at the end of the month. We have begun practising for the events and are enjoying making use of the local field to do this. We have rearranged our class trip to the church so we are looking forward to that within the next few weeks too. It has been lovely to hear how some children in Acorns class have been working within and supporting our local community outside school; please do keep sharing your news on this with us.

Character Education

As being recognised as a school of character is very important to Burlescombe, it has been fantastic to hear the children using the language of virtue in conversation with each other. Our virtue focus is currently **respect**. The children are all making an effort to show respect to each other, staff and the world around us at all times. We have enjoyed reading stories about the importance of respect and played a great game using different respect-based scenarios.

Innovation

As the sun has been shining, we have tried to be outside as much as we can. The children have been creating marvellous sculptures in the sand - we had to work hard and demonstrate resourcefulness and determination to make some of our structures stay together! Some year 2 children have been working very hard on creating their own story book - they have been writing and illustrating each page with beautiful handwriting and detailed drawings, and we are all very excited to see the finished product.

Squirrels

Academic

Both Years 3 & 4 have started a new topic in maths, which is looking at money. In English, we have been writing book reviews about a story that we enjoyed reading and want to recommend to other children. In French, we have started a new topic looking at vocabulary connected to school life; the children are really enjoying trying out their growing language skills!

Community

With Sports Day fast approaching, Squirrels class are starting to think about the events they will take part in, and are looking forward to using the field in Bray Close to practise some events. I do have to say that it is delightful to hear about everything children are doing in their local communities to help out in some way. This is their first step along the path of becoming the Global Citizens they will be in the future. **Character Education**

We are thinking about the virtue of respect this week, talking about what that looks like in the classroom and in the wider world. We are thinking about the idea of treating other people the way that we would like to be treated and the difference being respectful makes.

Innovation

Squirrels class have been looking at homophones this week, writing brilliant sentences to show the different meanings of words that sound the same. Some of the sentences were silly, some sensible, but they were all super! :)

Academic

This week, we have been learning all about newspaper reports. We have been listening to a true story about an amazing quest two families took over the Berlin wall in 1979. We have then been compiling that information, and information we have been researching, into a newspaper report.

Community

Character Education
